



The Difference between a Babysitter vs Nanny

Babysitter	Nanny
Sits in the home while caring for the children.	Engages with the children on their level.
Does not bring anything with them.	Comes prepared with coloring books, activities, or arts and crafts!
Updates the parents when asked.	Provides a detailed What We Did Today sheet for all families listing what you did with the children, their meals or snacks, diaper changes etc.
Is paid a lower hourly rate	Is paid a higher-than-average rate due to higher quality care.
Does not need experience, pay reflects needs from family	Viewed as a professional, pay reflects experience and professionalism
Does not necessarily pay attention to attire.	Dresses professionally and modestly
Provides snacks	Provides meal prep and cooking meals
Does not typically transport children	Transport children to school, to activities, to playdates, runs errands for family

Our dress code consists of a Nannies Who Care shirt preferably a blue or pink appropriate shirt to represent our company colors. We will always require our nannies to dress modestly and professionally. Shorts, ripped jeans, tank tops, or crop tops etc. are not permitted while in client's homes. Families require nannies to have clear studs or remove facial jewelry to prevent injury and for liability purposes.
